Description of the developed activities:

We decided to make this partnership because we want students to be educated, to know how to make the difference between good and bad, to find positive patterns, to find that they always have a positive alternative, no matter how difficult the situation of life is.

This partnership aims to promote the acquisition of attitudes, skills and civic knowledge through traditional and innovative stories relevant to different students coming from different areas of life and from different cultures. Encouraging students to read stories makes them discover attitudes and qualities that can help them develop securely in the 21st century. In this way, students see the difference between good and bad (national stories have the ability to see the differences between positive and negative powers) and become aware of the true values of the contemporary world and the problems we face each day.

Between 18th March 2019 – 22nd March 2019, “Grigore Antipa” Technological High School was present at the first learning activity of the project "Embracing European Values through Tales" (2018-2020), which brings together schools from six countries and is run with the financial support of the Program of the European Union for Education, Training, Youth and Sport 2014-2020, Erasmus +. This meeting consisted in the participation of one/ two teacher(s) and two pupils from each country involved in activities that were based on the presentation of traditional representative stories. Thus, under the title "Our Representative Tales", each participant team presented in an original way the traditional story chosen.
